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Pursuant to AB 361, the City is authorized to hold public meetings via teleconferencing and to make public meetings accessible telephonically or otherwise electronically to all members of the public, without making available any physical location for the public.

**City of Concord Rules:** The City of Concord has declared a local state of emergency due to COVID-19 and is closed to the public. This Concord City Council meeting is an essential event, therefore it has not been cancelled. However, City of Concord officials and staff will conduct this meeting telephonically or otherwise electronically. The City will **not** make available any physical location from which members of the public may observe the meeting and offer public comment. # Meeting of the Recreation, Cultural Affairs and Community Services Committee

- a. **Considering** – proposal from the Concord Arts Association to place artwork on 20 traffic signal cabinets that are located citywide. **Oral report by Justin Ezell, Assistant City Manager.**

Following an oral report and presentation from staff and the Concord Art Association, the Committee directed staff to bring the following recommendations to the City Council for consideration:

1. Authorize use of twenty traffic signal controller boxes located throughout the city for public art;
2. Authorize staff to support the program; and
3. Allocate \$10,000 from the Art in Public Places fund to support the program.

- b. **Considering** – a request from Monument Impact to extend its agreement to lease the Keller House for one additional year. **Report by Justin Ezell, Assistant City Manager.**

Following a report from staff and input provided by Monument Impact, the Committee directed staff to bring a recommendation to amend and extend the lease for an additional five years to the City Council for Consideration.
